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Materials

Womens Institute Premium Acrylic yarn in A and B
4mm crochet hook
Scissors
Tapestry needle

Abbreviations

ch - chain
ttr – treble crochet
beg – beginning
yo – yarn over hook

Pattern Notes


ch3 at beginning of round counts as a stitch

Tapestry crochet allows you to use two (or more) colours on the same row of a pattern. You will need to 'carry' your second yarn inside the stitches of your first yarn. We will be using treble crochet stitches throughout using two different colours, you will only use one colour at a time. The colour that is not being used will be carried over inside the stitches, dropped and picked up as needed.

Yarn B will be visable at the edge of you work, this is normal and will be covered by your blankets border.

Reading the graph

Each square on the grid represents a stitch. Start in the bottom right hand corner, next to the number 1, and work from right to left on the first row, then left to right on the second row, and so on until the end of the pattern.



Method

Using yarn A and a 4mm hook

Row 1


ch3 (counts as 1tr) 1tr in each st until the last 2 sts, skip 1 st and tr in the last st. (145 sts)

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Row 2 – 44

Follow the chart on the next page.



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
